## Local chapters

Our local chapters provide educational programs and opportunities to become actively involved in community projects involving native Texas plants and habitats. Many chapters offer virtual presentations along with their regular meetings. Some chapters offer scholarships to students of Texas native plant. When you join a local chapter, a percentage of your dues is rebated to your chosen chapter(s) for their use to help cover expenses. If you don't live near a chapter or for any reason do not want to join a chapter, you may choose to become a Member-at-large.

#### Programs we sponsor

In addition to the state-wide programs listed below, many of our chapters sponsor local programs in their specific areas. Our NICE Native Plant Partners program is a collaborative effort between the Society and local growers and retail nurseries to make native plants more available to consumers. Local chapters choose the native plants for their area and feature them at nurseries with special displays and other publicity.

The Native Landscape Certification Program is a series of day-long classes that teach the practice of using native plants in home and commercial landscapes. Classes are available in the spring and fall to members and non-members in many areas

of the state.

The Bring Back the Monarchs to Texas program encourages the preservation of native milkweed and nectar plants along the central flyway of this migrating species. Grants are awarded to schools and communities to create waystations for the

monarch butterflies. We also have speakers available to organizations who want to learn more about the importance of native plants in the monarch life-cycle.

The Ann Miller Gonzalez Research Grant makes awards each year to promote native plant research by graduate and undergraduate students at Texas universities.

Our Kate Hillhouse Scholarship and the Dr. Alfred Richardson Scholarship awards undergraduate scholarships for the study of native plants at a Texas college or university.

# Symposiums and other events

Each year we sponsor a day-long symposium in the spring in collaboration with the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center,

and we sponsor a three-day symposium in the fall at a location which rotates through the state's many eco-regions. These

symposiums are an opportunity to explore and learn more from scholars and experts about the native plants in the many

habitats of our state. Our chapters also sponsor Wildscape Workshops and other events in various locations. Our YouTube Channel offers an abundance of presentations and educational videos.
